#### **Class Update**

The class has worked hard on **Collective Nouns, Subject Verb Agreement and Sentence Construction Patterns** this past weeks. To aid the students in absorbing the information, we have charts on collective noun samples in the classroom and a flowchart to guide the students in knowing which verb form agrees with which collective noun (given as a hand-out).

We have yet to work on suffixes and animal names as verbs. The pace might seem slow for some but please note two things: the lessons do not focus narrowly on the textbook alone but are as comprehensive as possible for the level and, along with the lessons, we are also learning proper format and how to read instructions properly so as to understand what we need to do for the activity.

Our work on **Information Reports** has been suspended for a week but will be continued next week as we officially begin working on our A&E 1: Information Report.

Our **Spelling Test** results have gone down a tiny bit as peer-marking has led to observations and class discussions on correct letter formations (a, g, p, r, s, v, y) and why we should follow format instructions (it instills discipline and allows the reader to easily and quickly find information).
