Dear P6 Parents,

Here is a short update on what has been happening in English class for the last month:

#### **Class Update**

In working on using more descriptive language in writing, the students' work manifested a need to resharpen paragraph- and essay-construction skills. To address this issue, their essay has been a major work in progress in class. We have had discussions on what to include in an essay (MC - INCLUDE how the voice sounds reassuringly in your ear when you are sad; DO NOT INCLUDE that she shaves her legs every Sunday. Some things are private.) word association (MC - USE warmth, strict, caring, etc; DO NOT USE oily complexion.) and correct construction.

Kudos goes to Eben Jahja who contributed to the class' learning as he presented a powerpoint on how to construct 5-sentence paragraphs and 5-paragraph essays. The worksheet on essay construction which serves as the students' HW this weekend was considerately provided by our guest lecturer to assist his classmates in organizing their essays. Hopefully this further assists the classes in organizing their composition.

# **Spelling Tests**

As you well know by now, our spelling tests are a little different from the usual teacher-says-students-spell format. The focus, although still on spelling, is also on vocabulary and word use. Class discussions on this have introduced the children to the analogy that knowing how 5 million words are spelt and not knowing how to use them properly in sentences is like having the best nuts and bolts and gears and hardware pieces at home but not knowing how to assemble them together to make something truly useful.

Students are encouraged to learn for themselves the nuances of the words and their uses by learning how it is used (part of speech) and exposing themselves to various sentence examples using the words with the objective of noting the words it is often used with.

# **P6 Supplementary Classes**

The students started off with a reviewer on Nouns – common and proper. They noted in their refection that the activity allowed them to review these basic concepts, which some have forgotten, as well as reminded them to use capital letters for proper nouns. This is very important as one of the issues some P6 students face is not knowing when to capitalize letters in a sentence.

With all this happening, we have adjusted our schedules as reflected in the Schedule of Activities this comes with. Kindly note all changes in italics.
